The Harriet Collington Foundation

The Harriet Collington Foundation (HCF) has been established to further the legacy of Harriet Collington, her sister Catherine Arnott, and successive generations of remarkable Collington women who were pioneers in their respective fields.

HCF works today with aligned and ambitious partners towards a vision of philanthropic funding catalysing flows of new impact investment to transform the delivery of social impact at scale in the UK and internationally. The Foundation's medium-term goal is to mobilise US\$150mn of catalytic philanthropic funding. It will accomplish this by:

- Delivering research, engagement and advocacy to promote strategies and solutions that enable grant funders to catalyse social impact at scale
- Commissioning advisers to help build investment readiness and develop blended finance impact investment solutions to attract impact investment
- Sourcing grant funding for blended finance impact investment vehicles to catalyse the sustainable growth of impact-led enterprises.

HCF's focus is on the impact themes most critical to achieving social justice. At a high level these are better healthcare, gender equality, social inclusion, quality education, and economic development. HCF also addresses the inter-dependent threat of the climate crisis as it works with its partners to secure a socially just transition to a net zero world.
